

## **EVIL GENIUS**

## THE BILDUNGSROMAN

A *bildungsroman*, also known as a coming-of-age story, is a <u>narrative</u> that deals with a sensitive or tragic protagonist's psychological and moral development during the teenage, or formative, years. The tragic element is usually set up in the <u>exposition</u> of the story and this frames the narrative.

The character in a *bildungsroman* will undertake a journey to find some meaning in his/her existence and by doing so will experience a series of conflicts or challenges to social values during the <u>rising action</u> of the story. During this journey the character generally will suffer disappointment and make a series of mistakes that will come to a <u>climax</u> and then are resolved once the character gains maturity and acceptance during the <u>falling action</u> of the narrative. From these <u>resolutions</u> the responder is able to define the coda, or moral message, of the story.

The *bildungsroman* often will reflect a sense of <u>realism</u>, even in <u>allegorical narratives</u>, in order to effectively convey these messages to the target audience.

1. Where does the word 'bildungsroman' originate and what is its literal meaning?				
2. The first recognised <i>bildungsroman</i> is <i>Wilhelm Meister's Apprenticeship</i> (1795) followed by such iconic works as <i>David Copperfield</i> (1850) and <i>Catcher in the Rye</i> (1951). Do some literary research, identify a <i>bildungsroman</i> from the 21 <sup>st</sup> Century and explain how you feel this narrative meets the criteria of the genre. You may look at a range of textual mediums: film, graphic novel, anime, video game, biography, etc.
